L'Oeuvre Scientifique (Scientific Writings)

PIERRE TEILHARD DE CHARDIN

10 volumes (about 5,000 pages) plus 1 volume of maps

This collection unites all of Teilhard's scientific texts, published mostly in inaccessible journals. All texts are published in their original version; half are in English and half in French. About ten percent of the texts are published here for the first time.

None of the texts in the series Oeuvres de Teilhard de Chardin (which have been published by Les Editions du Seuil and most of which have been translated into English and published by Collins or Harper) are published in this series of L'Oeuvre Scientifique. (For the reader's convenience a list of texts, not the texts themselves, from scientific journals which have been published by Les Editions du Seuil has been included.)

By volume this collection of scientific writings is the largest part of Teilhard's lifetime work. It should be evident that no serious scholarly work on Teilhard can be done without consulting this important body of writings.

COMMENT: "The purely scientific opus of Teilhard is considerable. It is still ignored but for some rare specialists. Its publication is desirable under several points of view. It allows us to know better, and thus to critique knowingly, the scientific foundations of writings such as the *Human Phenomenon*. At the same time it reassures the readers of the already published *Oeuvre* who may believe some polemicists and have doubts about Teilhard's being a true scientist. Thanks to this publication one can have a better knowledge about the scientist, his methodological rigor, his analytical proceedings and his field research. This publication saves a great number of important memories from being forgotten about, for their extreme dispersion had made them practically inaccessible and most difficult to be located."
