All aspects of the topic and all philosophical points of view are welcome. Preliminary inquiries and abstracts for review or comment are welcome until 1 June 1990, after which finished manuscripts will be required.

Two nonreturnable copies of final manuscripts are requested, all matter double spaced and notes placed separately at the end. All manuscripts must be in English. Please consult the University of Chicago *Manual of Style*. To insure blind review, neither the author's name nor institutional affiliation, if any, should appear on the manuscript itself.
