The God Question in an Age of Science

This conference will be an exploration of the concept/symbol/experience of God by theologians, philosophers, and scientists. Topics addressed will include: (1) Meaning. To what does the word God refer? For example, Is God an objective reality? A transforming experience? An internal mental construct? Or . . .? What, if any, is the action of God in the world? (2) Functions. What are the functions of the concept/symbol/experience of God? What role does it play in formulating, transforming, and transmitting our values, our ethics, and our identity? (3) Methods. How can we talk about God? How do we articulate, justify, and validate statements about God (including statements that reject the concept)? How do we evaluate the testimony provided by tradition, by personal or collective experiences, by reason, by scientific research, by prediction or prophecy? How do we know God—or can we? (4) Alternatives/Equivalents. What concepts/symbols/experiences are alternatives to God for individuals who are not theists and for religions in which God does not play a central role?

There will be small-group workshops to give conferees an opportunity to actively engage in the construction of theologies based on their own personal experience and understanding, taking into account current theological and scientific understandings. There will also be workshops on the role of music, art, and dance in rituals by which the concept/symbol/experience of God is understood nonverbally.
