In Memoriam

Two persons died last spring who have been important to this journal. Both of them devoted many hours to the production of Zygon, often with little public recognition.

Calla Butler Burhoe, 1908-1995

Calla Burhoe was a tireless coworker in Zygon's founding and early years. Particularly in the first fifteen years of the journal's existence, she served as a copy editor, proofreader, and editorial advisor. She died on 5 February 1995, at the age of eighty-six.

Carol D. Peters, 1937-1995

Carol Peters served as assistant editor of Zygon from September 1981 through December 1986. In this post, she took reponsibility for much of the management of the journal, as well as copy editing and proofreading. She died on 20 March 1995, at the age of fifty-seven.

These two women will be remembered gratefully and honored for their willingness to dedicate their efforts to our enterprise, as well as for the standards of excellence that they achieved. They stand as models for all of us who follow in their train.
