

## *In Memoriam*

RALPH W. GERARD

1900–1974

Ralph W. Gerard died on February 17. He was an outstanding scientist, known internationally for his hundreds of published research papers and his many books dealing with problems in neurophysiology. Holder of both Ph.D. and M.D. degrees and a number of honorary doctorates and prizes, he served successively as professor of physiology at the University of Chicago, professor of neurophysiology at the University of Michigan Mental Health Research Institute, and dean of the Graduate Division of the University of California, Irvine.

Gerard, who was on the editorial advisory board of *Zygon*, was active in support of the conferences of the Institute on Religion in an Age of Science and of the Center for Advanced Study in Religion and Science in Chicago.

DANIEL DAY WILLIAMS

1910–1973

Daniel Day Williams, a member of the editorial advisory board of *Zygon*, died in December. For fifteen years he was associated with Chicago Theological Seminary and the Divinity School of the University of Chicago. In 1959 he became professor of systematic theology at Union Theological Seminary in New York. His major work, *The Spirit and the Forms of Love* (1968), exemplified his concern for relating Christian faith and contemporary modes of thought.
